Minutes

Minutes of the Fifth Meeting of the Academic Council of Sardar Patel University of Police, Security and Criminal Justice, Jodhpur held on January 15, 2015 at 11.30 am in the Conference Hall of the University.

The Vice-Chancellor extended a warm welcome & thanked the members for sparing their valuable time to attend the meeting. One of the members Mr. Rajagopal enquired about the progress of construction work at permanent campus and about the courses, which were passed in past meeting of Academic Council, the Vice-Chancellor gave the details about the progress of work at permanent campus of the University. He stated that construction work of Ist phase of the University is on full swing and to be completed by January 20, 2016. He further informed that the cost estimate of the project is Rs. 30 Crores for Ist phase.

With the consent of Vice-Chancellor, the Pro-Vice-Chancellor gave a detailed description of the courses conducted by the University during the session 2014-15, the number of students in each course and the number of drop outs. The Pro-Vice-Chancellor also gave details about the activities conducted by various centres of the University. One of the members Mr. Rajagopal suggested to begin Academic Programmes on Road Safety for transport and police officials. Pro-Vice-Chancellor also described the evaluation system of the University.

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The following items were taken up for consideration:

1. Agenda Item No. 5/1:

The Vice-Chancellor pointed out that the minutes of the last meeting had been circulated by the office and requested the Members for their comments, if any. As there were no comments, the Vice-Chancellor state that it might be presumed that the Minutes have been recorded correctly.

Resolution No. AC/5/1: Resolved that the council confirmed the minutes of the 4th meeting of the Academic Council. (Annexure-I)

2. Agenda Item No. 5/2:

The Vice-Chancellor informed and discussed the recommendations of the Course Design Committee for various new courses i.e. LL.M/M.A in Criminal Law and M.A in International Relations and Conflict Studies, which is suggested and prepared by faculty members and subject experts members from the relevant field. It was also informed that University is willing to start these courses from the coming session 2015-16. The Vice-Chancellor informed the bridge course paper for M.A. in Criminal Law for students from non-law background.

Resolution No. AC/5/2: Resolved that the proposed courses i.e. L.L.M. in Criminal Law and M.A. in International Relations and Conflict Studies be started from the next academic session 2015-16. It was also suggested that the courses be advertised earnestly, so that entrance exam can be conducted in March and session begin from July, 2015 and the bridge course be done from April-July, before the course begins in July. 3. Agenda Item No. 5/3:

The Vice-Chancellor informed the Council that to update the syllabus. Some changes in few subjects were required. The recommendations of various Board of Studies were presented.

- Meeting of board of studies for Sociology (for 5 year Integrated Program) was held on 9th
 January 2015 in University Conference hall and a few changes in the syllabus were
 suggested and incorporated.
- Meeting of board of studies for English (for 5 year Integrated Program) was held and few changes in the syllabus were suggested and incorporated.

Resolution No. AC/5/3: Resolved that the proceedings of the various Board of Studies for UG classes be approved. (Annexure-III)

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4. Agenda Item No. 5/4:

The Vice-Chancellor discussed the Panel of Experts for the Post of Professor/Associate Professor/Assistant Professor in the following subjects:

- Computer Science and Cyber Security and Digital Forensics
- b. Police Studies / Criminology
- c. Law
- d. Psychology
- e. Security and Intelligence Studies
- f. Forensic Sciences
- g. Social Defence and Gender Studies

The Academic Council members discussed and finalized the Panel of Experts for Selection Committee for various teaching positions in the University

Resolution No. AC/5/4: Resolved that the enclosed approved Panel of Experts of various subjects duly signed by the Council Members may be sent to Chairman, RPSC in a sealed envelope for further action.

5. Agenda Item No. 5/5:

The Vice-Chancellor informed the Academic Council members that the University planned to start the Ph.D. Programme in various discipline and for approve the Ph.D. regulation and recognition of Research Supervisor/Co-Supervisor. The Ph.D. draft regulation is placed before the Council.

Resolution No. AC/5/5: Resolved that 02 years of experience of PG teaching is essential to become Research Supervisor and approved the same draft of regulations.

6. Table Agenda Item No. 5/6: M.A. Executive Programme in Police Studies for inservice Police Professionals.

Resolution No. AC/5/6: Resolved that Council principally agreed to begin the programme. It was suggested that the syllabus be prepared and passed by the relevant bodies like Course Design Committee etc. Further it was advised by member that some incentive like State Visit or a Foreign Country Visit should be added in the programme.

7. Table Agenda Item No. 5/7: To begin a Certification Program in Cyber Security.

Resolution No. AC/5/7: Resolved that the University may begin certificate programme in Cyber Security.
