SCHEME OF ENTRANCE EXAMINATION AND ADMISSION FOR

LL.M./M.A. (CRIMINAL LAW) PROGRAMME

1. For LL.M. programme aspirants:

The entrance examination shall be based on multiple choice questions, which shall be 50 in numbers (one mark for each question and total of 50 marks). There shall be no negative marking.

The syllabus for the entrance exams shall be as follows:

- a) Indian Constitutional Law
- **b)** Major Criminal Laws
- c) Contemporary Legal issues
- d) General Legal awareness

2. For M.A. programme aspirants (only for in-service person from law enforcement agencies):

The admission shall be based on merit and same shall be calculated on candidates' academic, research and professional credentials.
